Formation Friday – February 5, 2021

The Conversion Process: Ongoing and continuous conversion of the heart

For each week of Lent focus on one action item below that you would like to cultivate in a special way as part of your Lenten journey.

1. Make an act of reparation or a modification of behavior to show sorrow for sin.

2. Be willing to recognize and accept suffering as the consequence of separating myself from God. (Offer sufferings for the benefit of others.)

- 3. Commit to a plan for prayer, fasting, almsgiving. (See: Joel 2:12-18)
- 4. Intentionally evangelize a lukewarm or nonbeliever.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to make me aware of a specific moral shortcoming and for the grace to change.
- 6. Consciously live the Beatitudes.
- 7. Seek personal conversion through deeper prayer.
- 8. Radically commit to the Gospel life centered on the person of Jesus.
- 9. Savor God's mercy, experiencing the love of God which unceasingly calls us back to Himself.
- 10. Accept myself as I am now and strive to reach a deeper level of conversion.

11. Journal on my spiritual journey made up of failures and falls and also made up of new beginnings, new discoveries.

12. Use St. Francis's paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer for meditation.

A Franciscan Blessed Blessed Agnellus of Pisa (1st Order)

(1195-1236)



A native of Pisa, Italy, Agnellus was received into the Franciscans by their holy founder, Francis himself. Francis sent Agnellus to introduce the order in France. Agnellus founded the order's house at the University of Paris, thus cementing the Franciscan relation with what was then the finest educational institution in Europe.

In 1224, Francis sent Agnellus to bring the Franciscan Order to England. Landing at Dover with eight others, Agnellus established houses in London and Oxford. When he set up the school for theology at Oxford, he hired the august scholar Robert Grosseteste as lecturer. In time this school was associated with a number of outstanding figures including Roger Bacon, William of Ockham, and Blessed John Duns Scotus. Agnellus also became involved in politics, serving as a peace envoy between King Henry III and Richard Marshall, the Earl of Pembroke.

Despite these somewhat worldly associations, Agnellus embraced Lady Poverty. When he added an infirmary to the Oxford friary he made the ceilings so low that a man could barely stand in them, and he never acquired more land for any house than was strictly necessary.

In the three days leading to his death in 1236, Agnellus was in great pain. "Come sweetest Jesus" was his constant plea.
